

# The Blue Star Program

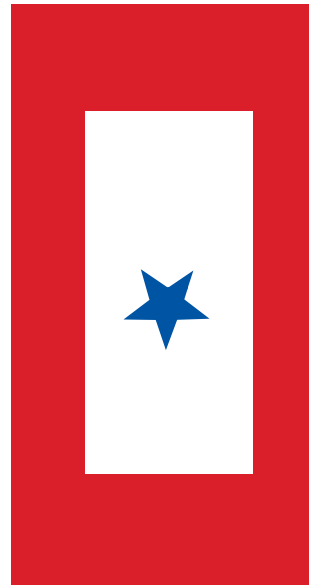
The Blue Star Service Banner was designed and patented in 1917 by World War I Army Capt. Robert L. Queissner of the 5th Ohio Infantry who had two sons serving on the front line. It quickly became the unofficial symbol of a child in the service.

On Sept. 24, 1917, an Ohio Congressman read the following into the Congressional Record: "...The Mayor of Cleveland, the Chamber of Commerce and the Governor of Ohio have adopted this service flag. The world should know of those who give so much for liberty. The dearest thing in all the world to a father and mother - their children."

During World War II, the Department of War issued specifications on the manufacturing of the flag as well as guidelines indicating when and by whom the service flag could be flown and the service lapel button could be worn.

The Department of Defense updated the guidelines on December 1, 1967 with DoD Directive 1348.1, which implemented an Act of Congress authorizing a service flag and a service lapel button (U.S.C. 179-182).

Today Blue Star Service Banners are displayed by families who have a loved one serving in the armed forces including the National Guard and Reserves of all military departments. The banner displayed



in the front window of a home shows a family's pride in their loved one serving in the military, and reminds others that preserving America's freedom demands much.

The City is proud to have the opportunity to honor those family members.

By completing and returning the application in this brochure, City residents with immediate family members in the military will receive a Blue Star Service Flag, lapel pin and window decal from the City for each immediate family member currently serving in the military. A banner with the honoree's name will also be placed along Whittier Boulevard.

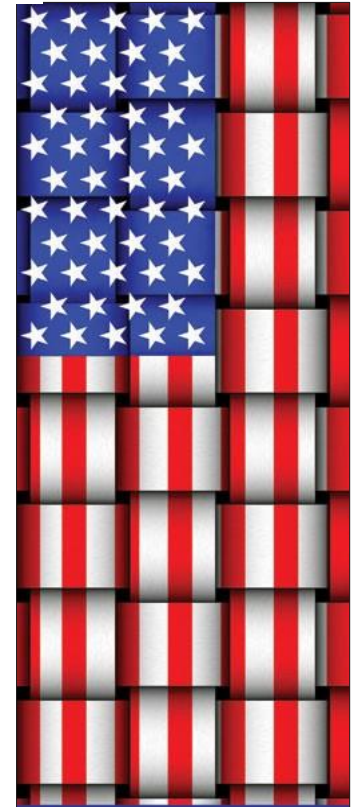
